26 The Academic Misconduct Co-ordinator will keep a record of the meeting and pass this and any work/reports/evidence to the Chair of the relevant Examining Board You will also receive a copy If the Academic Misconduct Co-ordinator does not consider there is an academic misconduct case it will be dismissed and they will inform you

Procedures for investigation of alleged Academic Misconduct

of alleged academic misconduct and cheating and where a case is identified including after an award has been made or the student has left the University, the case will be fully investigated using these procedures If an Academic Misconduct Committee concludes, retrospectively, that an offence had occurred then the appropriate penalty will be

Student Academic Misconduct Procedure 1 Introduction - What is academic misconduct? 11 Students are expected to submit their own work and give credit to other people’s ideas This is described as having academic integrity Work that does not adequately credit other people’s work lacks academic integrity, even if there was no intention to deceive Students whose work shows poor
